The policy of the Philadelphia Club Foundation is to provide a limited number of scholarships each year based on need and funding availability.

In addition to being currently employed at a club with a current chapter member of the Philadelphia and Vicinity Club Management Association, the Board takes in consideration your future within the management and operations of clubs. Scholarships are awarded based upon successful completion of the course; travel and housing expenses are not included. **Scholarships will be given for industry related courses only.**

To be reimbursed, you will be required to submit proof of successful completion of the industry course and a receipt showing the amount paid for tuition. If approved, the Philadelphia Club Foundation will reimburse your club for the tuition expense.

We avoid conflicts of interest whereby personal, financial, or other considerations have the potential to influence or compromise professional judgment and objectivity with those doing business with our clubs.

We comply with club law and provide our club officers/trustees with applicable specific requirements of Federal, State and Local laws, statutes, and regulations.

We distinguish between our personal convictions and professional responsibilities and do not allow our personal beliefs to interfere with the operations of our clubs/facilities.
